



leaders of the 20th Century. J.P. Morgan, William Rockefeller, Joseph Pulitzer, members of the exclusive Jekyll Island Club, came here from the North and Midwest to escape the harsh winters. They hunted, golfed, played tennis, frolicked on the beaches, basked in the clean air, and enjoyed the elegant natural beauty of this barrier island.

Many of their cottages, staff quarters, and out buildings remain today to remind us of this fascinating vignette of American History.
