2023 Auction Report

The 2023 Online Auction was a great success! Much better than expected since we had fewer solicitors, fewer auction items, and fewer bidders compared to 2022. We grossed \$51,793.00, and after expenses, we netted \$49,319.03. The funds from this year's auction were earmarked for the Baker-Crane Carriage House rehabilitation; the first phase of this long-term project is the stabilization of the building.

Thank you to Auction Committee members Debbie Boyd, Carol Fritz, Tim Kinsey, Justin Wilbur, Rob Stewart, Ted Fleshman, and Sara Cant. A HUGE THANK YOU to all our solicitors and donors; without you there would be no auction. I also want to send a thank you to all our bidders who made the auction a financial success.

Out of the 190 bidders, 60 -65 registered in the last three days of the auction. Not surprisingly, the majority of bidders were from Georgia (66%) with 34% from other states plus one military address. There were 73 winning bidders: 31.5% were from Jekyll Island; 37% from other parts of Georgia; and 31.5% from other states. (This data is based on the addresses provided by the bidders.)

We look forward to the 2024 Online Auction being as successful! I hope some of you will consider volunteering to assist with the auction

Historical Resources Report

Tom Alexander, Director of Historical Resources

The Tiffany Window conservation is complete as to cleaning and repairing the window itself. The work was completed by John Bowe and Rosemary Shepherd of Kekekabic Studios.

The window will be reinstalled in late summer following repairs being made for its framing at Faith Chapel.

The stabilization of the Baker-Crane Carriage House is in progress, starting in May.

Josie Van Tassel, the most recent intern, completed her rotation as of April 13. Two new interns have been selected and will start in June. The Chuck Diefenderfer Internship Program is financed by FOHJI.

The outdoor classroom is progressing and is still scheduled for completion this summer.

We completed another successful year of FOHJI programs. We had a series of interesting talks over the past months, and I want to thank all our presenters.

In February, Pam Mueller spoke not only about her most recent book, *The Sky Is My Home*, but also about her writing process. She followed her presentation with a book signing. In March, FOHJI welcomed Michael Seibert, the Chief of Resource Management at Fort Frederica National Monument and Cumberland Island National Seashore. His presentation "Reinvigoration of Archeology- Fort Frederica NM" generated many questions and interest in revisiting Fort Federica. Our final program was well attended even with some rain showers. Reverend Dave Hanson spoke about the life and tribulations of John Westley during his time in Georgia from March 1736 to January 1737.

The hospitality committee made each talk better by providing delicious refreshments and wine during the post-talk socializing.

I'm in the process of planning next season's programs; our theme will be "Everything Jekyll Island". I'm working with Tom Alexander, Director of Historical Resources, to develop programs that will focus on Jekyll Island's history. He and his staff have a wealth of knowledge about our island, and they have the ability to bring history to life. Tom has suggested that we may include visits to historic buildings and locations as part of the programs. I hope to arrange a presentation on the Gullah Geechee Cultural Heritage Corridor which includes Jekyll Island. And, I hope we all learn something new and have some fun.

Financial Report Tim Kinsey, Treasurer

At April's end, FOHJI had a total of \$271,303.10 in checking and money market accounts held in Ameris Bank. Our successful fundraisers this year (Annual Dinner, Auction, Schuyler Concert) netted over \$50,000.00, which met our goal to fund the Baker-Crane foundation stabilization project.

Other projects we have approved for funding include the Tiffany Window conservation and two historical preservation internships. Approximately \$165,000.00 remains in our coffers for future projects, benefiting Jekyll Island's history.

Each issue of the Jekyll Journal will include a summary of FOHJI finances.
