FOHJI has committed to funding the replacement and installation of chimney caps on the cottages throughout the historic district. This work has begun, and the metals purchased for this project will mimic the 1930s metal; we love that we will be able to preserve the initial character to reflect the look of when the cottages were first built. Although most of the work on the Tiffany window has been delayed to accommodate previously committed events, I am pleased to report that the most immediate need for the window, the hurricane shutters, has been completed. We are looking forward to seeing the majority of the restorative work begin next January. We will be working with our JIA preservation partners to determine what our next projects will be. Stay tuned!


ANNUAL AUCTION



This publication guides visitors through the Historic District, providing information on each structure, and includes interior and exterior photos of the Cottages. For the text, Barbara updated and expanded upon a 1990s visitors booklet. Bradley photographed the interior of the Cottages, and historic photos of the Cottage exteriors came from the museum archives. Tom is responsible for the printing and sale of the book.

Financial Report By Ted Fleshman, Treasurer

FOHJI has a total of \$144,864 in checking and money market accounts. A total of \$57,230 is committed for projects, such as Tiffany Window Conservation (\$30,230), Chimney Caps (\$9,000), Pump House Rehabilitation (\$5,000), Internships (\$10,000), and the Historic FOHJI Guidebook (\$3,000), leaving a balance of \$86,633 available for new projects. The \$7,561 in Faith Chapel's account is committed to the Tiffany Window Conservation project.
